General Vision

The Egyptian abroad is not just an expatriate...

Main Objectives

1. Simplifying Consular Services:

- **Accelerating procedures:**

It's illogical for citizens to wait weeks to renew a passport or process a power of attorney.

We must improve digital systems in consulates to make services faster and without delay.

- **Opening branch offices in major cities:**

Thousands of Egyptians live far from embassies and travel hundreds of kilometers to complete paperwork.

The solution is to open mobile consular units or branch offices that operate 2–3 times a month in key cities.

- **Reducing fees and guaranteeing dignity:**

Some consulates impose high fees without receipts or justification.

We demand financial transparency, fair pricing, and respectful treatment for Egyptians abroad.

2. Supporting Bank Transfers:

- **Financial facilitation:**

Simplifying account opening procedures for expats and providing fee/customs exemptions for certain groups.

- **Lowering transfer fees:**

Many Egyptians use informal channels due to high costs.

We will negotiate with banks to reduce fees and increase value.

- **Encouraging official, secure mobile transfer channels:**

We will support secure and fast mobile applications for official transfers without complex steps.

3. Education & Identity for the Diaspora's Children:

- **Digital access to Egyptian curricula:**

A unified online platform with simplified materials, videos, and exams.

- **Supporting the establishment of Egyptian schools abroad:**

In coordination with the Ministries of Education and Immigration, we call for accredited Egyptian schools.

- **Providing scholarships and promoting national connection:**
Special scholarships for expat children, and programs like “Back to the Roots.”

4. Legal & Social Support for Egyptians Abroad:

- **24/7 emergency hotline in every embassy:**
A number that answers promptly in case of legal, humanitarian, or health emergencies.
- **Providing certified lawyers:**
A list of trusted, embassy-approved lawyers specializing in local laws to assist Egyptians.
- **Parliamentary follow-up on major cases:**
Significant or unfair incidents involving Egyptians abroad will be addressed in Parliament and supported politically.

5. Effective Political Participation:

- **Forming a permanent parliamentary committee for Egyptians abroad:**
A body within Parliament dedicated to voicing expat concerns and discussing them seriously.
- **Digital platforms for monitoring and participation:**
Modern online tools allowing Egyptians abroad to follow sessions and submit suggestions.

- **Strengthening real—not symbolic—representation:**

Representation should be meaningful, not just nominal. MPs must have tangible roles.

6. Direct Engagement with the Diaspora & Collective Decision-Making:

- **Creating online platforms for idea exchange:**

A website or app where Egyptians abroad can share ideas, initiatives, and vote on priorities.

- **Online discussion forums in cooperation with the Ministry of Immigration:**

Regular virtual meetings involving ministry officials and community reps to discuss challenges or projects.

7. Addressing the Living Realities of the Diaspora:

- **Coordinating with host governments to ensure rights:**

In collaboration with embassies and local authorities, we will protect Egyptians' rights in work, education, and healthcare.

- **Demanding fair labor contracts:**

Ensuring Egyptians are not exploited and receive lawful, clear contracts.

8. Supporting Youth Projects & Innovation Abroad:

- **Launching programs for Egyptian entrepreneurs abroad:**

Official programs offering consulting, training, and workshops.

- **Providing funding opportunities with Egyptian ministries:**

Soft Power & People's Diplomacy Proposals

 Initiative: Reuniting Egyptians Abroad – Live Interaction & Smart Promotion 

 Main Goal:

To turn consulates and embassies into vibrant social and cultural centers—not just service offices.

 Execution:

- Permanent exhibitions under consulate sponsorship:
 - Display of Egyptian heritage-inspired products
 - Cultural events showing Egyptian art and crafts in partnership with artisans
- Promoting tourism through the diaspora:
 - Diaspora members as Egypt's ambassadors
 - Cultural festivals and promotional events held at embassies
- Encouraging connection to Egyptian roots:
